UGC has notified 3rd Amendment in UGC Regulations on 29 June, 2016 to extend the definition of ragging by include the following:

Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background."

Counseling and monitoring measures

Regular interaction and counseling with the students to detect early signs of ragging and identification of trouble-triggers.

Surprise inspection at hostels, students' accommodation, canteens, rest-cum-recreation rooms, toilets, bus-stands and any other measure which would augur well in preventing/quelling ragging and any uncalled for behaviour/incident.

24. RESERVATION POLICY FOR ADMISSION

- 24.1 The prescribed percentage of Reservation for colleges receiving grant-in-aid from Central Government is 15% for SCs, 7% for STs and 27% in OBCs. St. Joseph's College is a Minority educational institution under Article 30(1) of the constitution and so exempted from this prescribed percentage Reservation.
- 24.2 St. Joseph's College, Jakhama, follows the Reservation policy of admission with 80% for STs, 5% for SCs, 5% for OBCs and 10% for General in admission to various courses/degrees.
- 24.3 If there are no sufficient applicants for a particular category of reservation, then the vacant seats shall be transferred to any other category of reservation. Once the vacant seats are transferred to other categories of reservation, then no one can claim the transferred seats again



25. ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- 25.1 It is the policy of St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Jakhama to offer Bachelor degree course and Master degree course to all qualified persons, provided required conditions are fulfilled by the applicant and as stated in the vision and mission of the College.
- 25.2 Admission shall be taken on the basis of merit and depending on the availability of seats.
- 25.3 The College shall conduct entrance test/personal interview before the admission of the candidate. A candidate must also obtain qualifying marks required by the College in entrance test/personal interview as the case may be. These marks shall be valid only for the academic year for which the test is conducted.
- 25.4 Admission will be on the basis of performance of the candidate at the qualifying examination, entrance test and/or personal interview.
- 25.5 Admissions shall ordinarily close after a specified period from the date of commencement of the first semester classes decided by the Management Board. However, in exceptional cases, admission of a candidate after the last date may be recommended with evidential and trustworthy justification and proof. Under such an event, this period shall not exceed four weeks from the date of commencement of the first semester classes.
- 25.6 If any student is given admission under the Article 25.5, then attendance of such student shall be computed from the date of admission.
- 25.7 No new admission shall be taken except in the first semester.
- 25.8 A student who fails in any semester exam may take readmission for the failed semester, however if a student fails the second time in any one of the semesters then the student has to discontinue studies in the College.
- 25.9 A candidate who is eligible to take admission shall pay at the time of admission the prescribed Admission Fee, monthly Tuition Fee and other College Fees.
- 25.10 A candidate must be accompanied by the parent/guardian to take admission, unless the admission is done online.
- 25.11 Admission will not be given to any candidate without the candidate meeting any one of the Management Board members for personal interview.
- 25.12 Parents/guardians or friends cannot take admission for a candidate if not accompanied by the student who seeks admission.
- 25.13 A candidate with body tattoo which is visible to the people is not allowed to take admission.
- 25.14 Admission fee and other fees once paid are not refundable. However, the Management Board may consider refund of first instalment fee and exam fee paid during admission, if a candidate decides to leave the college before the commencement of classes. After the commencement of classes (online/offline) even for one day, refund of any payment done during the admission will not be allowed in any case.
- 25.15 A student who takes Transfer Certificate (T.C) is not allowed to take readmission even after year(s) of break.
- 25.16 There is no guarantee that all those who have registered for admission will be selected for admission.
- 25.17 The College is implementing NEP -2020 in phase-wise and therefore, the principal shall give updates as and when needed.

26. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO BACHELOR DEGREE PROGRAMME

- 26.1 For B.A./B.Com/BBA/B.Sc. Degree: Higher Secondary or other equivalent examination.
- 26.2 For B.Sc. : 12 passed or equivalent from a recognized Board with the following conditions if an applicant wishes to take up Honours subject:
- 26.3.a. Minimum of 45% Marks in the subject in which one desires to take up Honours and with an overall aggregate of 45 % Marks in Higher Secondary Level.
- 26.3.b. Minimum of 45% in the aggregate to take up honours in a subject not available at Higher Secondary or equivalent level.
- 26.4 For B.A. Honours Courses: Minimum of 45% marks in the subject of choice with an overall aggregate of 45% marks in the Higher Secondary Level.
- 26.5 For English Honours Course: Minimum of 50% marks in English and with an overall aggregate of 45% Marks in the Higher Secondary Level.
- 26.6 For B. Com. Honours Course : Minimum of 45% marks in Accountancy and with an aggregate of 45% Marks in the Higher Secondary Level.
- 26.7 For BBA: Minimum of 50% aggregate Marks at the Higher Secondary level from any stream.
- 26.8 Change of Stream from XII Science to B.Com. shall be permitted only to those students who have a minimum of 45% marks in aggregate or above at Class XII Science Examination.
- 26.9 Students will be admitted on the basis of merit and depending on the availability of seats.
- 26.10 There is no guarantee that all those who are registered will be selected for admission.

27. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME

- 27.1 It is the policy St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Jakhama to offer Master's degree to all qualified persons, provided required conditions are fulfilled by the applicant and as stated in the vision and mission of the College.
- 27.2 All admissions to Post Graduate Programme in the College shall be on the basis of merit, availability of seats and eligibility criteria.
- 27.3 An applicant must have passed three-year Degree Course with Honours/Major with 50% marks and for General stream students of Arts with 55% in the concern subject in which admission is sought.
- 27.4 The Management Board shall notify at the beginning of the academic year the required conditions for admission to Master's degree programme.

28. ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR BOTH BACHELOR'S AND MASTER'S DEGREES

- 28.1 Admission process begins soon after the declaration of NBSE results of Higher Secondary Level and Nagaland University, Bachelor's Degree.
- 28.2 Application Form cum Prospectus is available in the College Office during working hours (8:30 am to 4: 00 pm, Monday to Friday and on Saturday 8:30 a.m to 12:00 noon) on payment of Rs. 250/-
- 28.3 The filled in application form has to be submitted and registered in the College Office on or before the date specified along with the attested copy of Mark sheet of Class X , XII and Bachelor's Degree with a registration fee of Rs. 100/-
- 28.4 The stages of admission
 - Stage I : Submission and verification of application form.
 - Stage II : Meeting the management team for verification of documents.
 - Stage III : Selected candidates can make payment for admission
