Concept Note

India's North East is a home to multifarious social and ethnic groups, sharing international boundaries with Bangladesh, Myanmar, China, Bhutan, Nepal and Tibet. Social science whose field of study is broad; the inter-disciplinary approaches is yet another sign of this evolution. Broad be its area of studies and crisscrossing into different horizon of investigations, research in social science is not without confusion when it comes to research and the conduct of research.

Research methodology in spite of it being a taught paper has to be supported by workshops and trainings, especially in the field of social science because of the dynamic nature of subject matter of social science. Every profession is not without research methods, though these would be in varying degree of usage of methods. It is through proper learning and application of right methodology that a person could strengthen and get advance in one's own profession. Therefore, should social science studies

be seen as a jumble of all things without proper methodology lacking validity and objectivity? The validity and objectivity of any finding in a study lies entirely upon the soundness of the research methodology and methods adopted by the researchers. The proposed workshop, attempts to emphasise the importance of research methodology in social science and introduce it as a serious exercise with proper conduct leading to validity and objectivity. Therefore, the workshop is designed for the young postgraduate students and young faculty members of social science to initiate in them the rigour and conduct of following proper approached and methods in doing research.
