

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (herein after referred to as "MOU") is made and entered into on this 14th day of June 2023 by and between the following parties.

Party- I

Alumni Association St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) Jakhama, Nagaland whose Office is located at the SJC (A) Jakhama premises herein referred to as '**Alumni Association SJC(A) Jakhama**', represented by its President **Mr. Thepfuvizo Vizo**

AND

Party- II

Pioneer Institute, Nagaland which has its office at, Kohima, Nagaland, in two centres 1. PUSA Complex, 5th Floor, BOC, Kohima, Nagaland 2. D-4 Central Building, Kezieke, Kohima above Indian Bank, hereinafter referred to as '**Training Partner**' represented by the Institute, Managing Director, **Mr. Kiviboto Sheqi**

AND

Party- III

St. Joseph's College, (Autonomous) Jakhama, located at Jakhama, under Kohima District, (hereinafter referred to as "SJC"), represented by the college Principal, **Dr. Fr. George Keduolhou Angami**

WHEREAS:

Party- I, the Alumni Association St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) Jakhama, Nagaland, is committed to fostering the future of the students and alumni students of St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Jakhama (hereinafter referred to as "SJC") by seeking opportunities for their educational growth.

Party- II, Pioneer Institute, Kohima, is a Coaching educational institution registered Under the Directorate of Technical Education, Govt. of Nagaland, providing Computer certificate courses, in any of the two centres. Pioneer Institute which is also a "Training partner" of NIELIT, Kohima, Nagaland.

Party- III, St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Jakhama, is an educational institution that has been leading the forefront for quality education since 19th March 1985 in Nagaland.

Party- I, wishes to request **Party- II**, to offer a discount on fees for coaching and computer classes to the students and alumni students of St. Joseph's College, Jakhama.

Party- II, is willing to offer discounts to the students of St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Jakhama, as requested by **Party- I** and herein the "Training partner" for SJC, Jakhama

Party- III, has agreed to the terms and conditions of this MOU.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Cooperation and Support:

- 1.1 **Party- I**, agrees to actively engage with **Party- II** to facilitate and encourage the provision of discounted coaching and computer classes to the students and alumni students of St. Joseph's College, Jakhama.
- 1.2 **Party- II** agrees to offer a discount of 33% discount in fees for coaching and computer classes to the students and alumni students of St. Joseph's College, Jakhama, subject to the terms and conditions agreed upon between **Party- II** and the individual students or alumni students from the college.

2. Eligibility and Enrollment:

- 2.1 The students and alumni students of St. Joseph's College, Jakhama, may request a discount for coaching and computer classes from **Party 2**.
- 2.2 The eligibility criteria, application process, and enrolment requirements shall be determined solely by **Party- II**.

3. 100% Scholarship:

- 3.1 The students and alumni students of St. Joseph's College, Jakhama, may request a discount for coaching and computer classes from **Party-II**. Additionally, **Party- I** and **Party- III** recognizes the importance of providing opportunities for deserving students who may require 100% scholarship assistance for computer Certificate course, based on their financial and meritorious conditions.
- 3.2. The criteria for consideration of 100% scholarships shall be as follows:
 - 3.2.1 **Financial Condition:** (a) Students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, as assessed through a comprehensive evaluation of their family income and financial resources. (b) Demonstrable financial need, taking into account factors such as family size, income, and other financial obligations, recognized by **Party- III**.
 - 3.2.2 **Meritorious Condition and Feats:** (a) **Academic Achievement:** Students who have consistently displayed outstanding academic performance, as demonstrated by their grades, academic awards, or recognition. (b) **Extracurricular Activities:** Students who have excelled in extracurricular activities, such as sports, cultural events, community service, leadership roles or any other notable accomplishments. (c) **Special Talents:** Students who possess exceptional talents or skills in fields such as arts, music, technology, or other areas recognized by **Party- III**.
 - 3.2.3 The selection process for 100% scholarships shall be transparent and fair, conducted by a designated committee or body appointed by **Party- III**. The committee shall thoroughly

evaluate the applications based on the aforementioned criteria and may request additional documentation or conduct interviews if necessary.

3.2.4 The 100% scholarship shall be given 1 (one only) to each of the Departments of the College for both a) undergraduate degrees viz- B.A, B.Sc., B. Com and BBA and Postgraduate degrees viz- M.A and M.Sc.

3.2.5 The final decision regarding the awarding of 100% scholarships shall rest with Party -III, considering the available resources and the number of eligible applicants.

4. Duration:

This MOU shall commence on the Effective Date and shall remain in effect for a period thereof unless terminated earlier by mutual written agreement of the Parties.

5. Termination:

Either Party may terminate this MOU by providing a written notice of termination to the other Parties with a minimum of one year prior written notice.

6. Confidentiality:

The Parties shall maintain the confidentiality of any non-public information shared during the course of this collaboration, except as required by law.

7. Governing Law and Dispute Resolution:

This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the jurisdiction in which Party 2 is located. Any disputes arising out of or in connection with this MOU shall be resolved amicably through negotiations between the Parties.

8. Entire Agreement:

This MOU constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and understandings, whether oral or written.

St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Jakhama, Nagaland represented by its Principal, **Dr. Fr. George Keduolhou Angami**, (Hereinafter referred to as the "FIRST PARTY")

And

St. Mary's Cathedral Hr. Sec. School, represented by its Principal **Rev. Fr. Vemedo Kezo** (hereinafter referred to as "SECOND PARTY").

The parties to this Agreement may hereinafter be individually referred to as the "Party" and collectively as "Parties".

WHEREAS,

- a) **St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Jakhama-Nagaland, India** (hereinafter referred to as "FIRST PARTY"), established in **1985**, recognized under Sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, accredited by NAAC with A Grade, is a premier constituent college of Nagaland University. FIRSTY PARTY was affiliated to North Eastern Hill University (NEHU), Shillong in 1985 and in 1994 got affiliated to Nagaland University, Lumami. FIRST PARTY is situated in an environmental friendly campus within the jurisdiction of Jakhama Village.

FIRST PARTY aims to educate, support and help young youth to be intellectually alert, morally upright, religiously oriented, socially conscious, culturally distinct and nationally integrated. FIRST PARTY offers Under Graduate and Post Graduate programmes in 13 different departments. The College address is P B No. 39, Kohima–Nagaland, 797001 and the College website is [www.https://stjosephjakhama.ac.in](http://www.stjosephjakhama.ac.in). SJC is managed by the Diocese of Kohima under the Chairmanship of the Bishop of Kohima, Nagaland.

- b) **FIRST PARTY** is desirous to associate with **SECOND PARTY** on various areas as discussed in the purview of this MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both institutions.

WHEREAS,

- a) **St. Mary’s Cathedral Hr. Sec. School**, was established in 1992. It is located at Lerie, Kohima. It is an educational institution managed by the Catholic Church, Diocese of Kohima. It aims to provide quality education to the students and strives to help the students to become responsible citizens.
- b) **SECOND PARTY** is desirous to associate with **FIRST PARTY** on various areas as discussed in the purview of this MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both the “Parties”.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing premises and the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to establish a collaborative agreement between the Parties to help, support and render possible service to each other using human resource and technical support.

2. AREAS OF COLLABORATIONS

Whereas, the Parties recognize that the academic collaboration would be of mutual benefit and would provide strengths in research and education and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic cooperation. As per the purpose of the said agreement, the two parties shall:

- i. Joint Faculty Empowerment and Career Development programmes
- ii. Sharing of human resources (faculty) in scholarly pursuits
- iii. Student Development Programmes
- iv. Counselling
- v. Value Education
- vi. Extension Activities/Programmes
- vii. Collaboration in the area of Education and Teacher Training
- viii. Any other area/activities of mutual interest that may emerge in future, after due deliberations and consent of both the parties.

3. AUTONOMY

- a) This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any financial obligations between the subscribing Parties.

4. TERM AND TERMINATION

- a) This MoU shall be effective for a period of five (5) years from the date of execution of this agreement, and shall be automatically renewed thereafter for another five (5) years unless a written notice to terminate or amend this agreement is given to the other party six (6) months in advance.
- b) It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration program. Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly set forth in the action plans.

5. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- a) Any dispute resulting from the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled through direct negotiation and common agreement by the persons delegated to such end by each Party. Either Party may propose to the other a modification of the Agreement at anytime in writing.

SJC is situated in an environmental friendly campus within the jurisdiction of Jakhama Village.

SJC has its vision to impart quality higher education based on Christian vision of life and in a Christian atmosphere. SJC strives to impart knowledge to young men and women and make contribution towards a transformative and progressive society. The college aims to educate, support and help young youth to be intellectually alert, morally upright, religiously oriented, socially conscious, culturally distinct and nationally integrated. SJC offers Under Graduate programme in 13 departments and Post Graduate programme in five departments. The College address is P.B No. 39, Kohima-Nagaland, 797001 and the College website is [www.https://stjosephjakhama.ac.in](https://stjosephjakhama.ac.in). SJC is managed by the Diocese of Kohima under the Chairmanship of the Bishop of Kohima, Nagaland.

- b) **SJC** is desirous to associate with **PCC** on various areas as discussed in the purview of this MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both institutions.

Whereas

- a) **Patkai Christian College, Seithekema, Chümoukedima, Nagaland, India** was sponsored by two church bodies namely, Nagaland Baptist Church Council and Manipur Baptist Convention. It was established in 1974. The College aims at imparting quality education to the young people, especially the tribals, within the framework of spiritual and moral absolutes, catering to the socio-economic needs of the region and pursuit of science and technology for the welfare of the human society and the world as a whole. The goals and objectives of the college are to impart biblical value based education, indispensable for ideal citizenship. To inculcate in the student the habit of analytical and critical thinking. To teach knowledge and demonstrate its use as an instrument for social and economic change. To produce future leadership in the church and society at large.
- b) **Patkai Christian College** got provisional affiliation with NEHU in 1975 and permanent affiliation in 1986. The affiliation was transferred to NU in 1994. The College was conferred with Autonomous Status in 2005 by UGC. The College was accredited 'A' Grade by NAAC. The College is a multidisciplinary institution of higher education offering courses in Arts, Science, Commerce and Music with 16 academic departments at the undergraduate level of study and 6 postgraduate departments. - c) PCC is desirous to associate with SJC on various areas as discussed in the Purview of this MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both Institutions.

That, relying on the principle of good faith, by virtue of which they will carry out all the possible actions for their due fulfillment,

And relying also on their common bonds and concerns, they state their interest in strengthening their relationships through academic cooperation, and for this end they are of one accord in entering this MoU.

NOW THEREFORE THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS

1. OBJECTIVE

The parties agree that the objective of the present MoU is to establish a cooperation program in order to collaborate towards the formation of students, academics and researchers for the promotion and development of their respective areas of interest.

2. METHOD FOR ACHIEVING THE OBJECTIVES

In order to achieve the aforementioned objectives, both parties, in mutual agreement, shall develop cooperation programs and projects that will specify the commitments each of them is to make for the performance of said programs.

3. AREAS OF CO-OPERATION

Whereas, SJC and PCC recognize that the academic collaboration would be of mutual benefit and would provide strengths in research and education and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic cooperation. As per the purpose of the said agreement, the two parties shall:

- i. Joint Faculty Empowerment and Career Development programmes
- ii. Sharing of human resources (faculty) in scholarly pursuits
- iii. Student Development Programmes
- iv. Counselling
- v. Value Education
- vi. Collaborations for Seminars/Webinars/Workshops
- vii. Extension Activities/Programmes
- viii. Joint Research Projects and Publications
- ix. Collaboration in the area of Education and Teacher Training
- x. Any other area/activities of mutual interest that may emerge in future, after due deliberations and consent of both the parties.

4. FUNDING

- a) Expenses for airfare, transportation, room and board and personal expenses of exchange students, teachers or officers shall be covered by each individual. Students will pay their registration and for courses or professional practices at their home institution, so that they can be recognized afterwards.
- b) Students, interns and officers shall be responsible for requesting and obtaining lodging by inquiring with the host institution, which shall provide every help necessary for them to obtain safe, convenient lodging arrangements.
- c) Financial expenses for (term visits) internships of professors and researchers, which will be arranged at the parties' request, as well as travel expenses, shall be covered by the requesting institution. No fees will be paid, as the assumption is that the professors/researchers remain in their positions at their home institution, which will continue to pay their salaries.

5. NO EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP

The parties agree that this Agreement shall not be construed in any manner as establishing any kind of partnership or bond of a labour nature between them. Thus, in all activities stemming from the present MoU and from subsequent specific action plans, the parties are in the understanding that, in all cases, employment relationships shall remain in force between the employing institution and its respective personnel.

6. CREDITS/ACCREDITATION

- a) Credits and grades shall be awarded in accordance with the academic achievement policies in force at the Institution/Affiliating University/Government. However, the Institution reserves the right to accept or reject any accreditation leading to an academic degree.
- b) The Institution shall issue a certification recognizing the grades obtained, as well as the hours invested on projects/papers completed by the students.
- c) It is noted that 6(a) and 6(b) are subject to the laws of the land, and rules and regulations promulgated by the affiliating university, if any, regarding the academic administration as well as transfer of academic credits.

7. RIGHTS AND DUTIES

- a) The Host Institution is committed to counseling and supporting students on exchange through advice on academic and administrative procedures, as well as to foster their integration, inviting and encouraging guest students to become involved in student life.
- b) The institutions shall act as facilitators, but they will have no obligation whatsoever in terms of the actions, behaviours or financial aspects of the

students/participants involved in the exchange.

- c) The students/participants shall enjoy the same rights and privileges as regular students/faculty, and shall observe the norms and rules of the Host Institution and the Host State. Any violation of the laws of the receiving State and/or the rules of the Host Institution by an exchange participant shall be grounds for the immediate termination of the privileges in the context of this Agreement.

8. AUTONOMY

- a) This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any financial obligations between the subscribing institutions.

9. TERM

- a) This MoU shall be effective from the date of execution of this agreement, and shall remain to be operative unless a written notice to terminate or amend this agreement is given to the other party six (6) months in advance.
- b) It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration program. Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly set forth in the action plans.

10. CONFLICT RESOLUTION

- a) Any dispute resulting from the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled through direct negotiation and common agreement by the persons delegated to such end by each Institution. Either party may propose to the other a modification of the Agreement at anytime in writing.

11. ACTION PLANS

- a) Every work program or specific activity that is agreed upon between both institutions shall be defined through an action plan, which shall be under the responsibility of two individuals, appointed respectively by each university/Institution, and which shall define the following aspects:
 - i. Foundations or considerations that warrant the plan for inter-institutional collaboration
 - ii. Objective of the action plan for inter-institutional collaboration
 - iii. General conditions of the plan
 - iv. Academic conditions of the plan
 - v. Administrative and organizational conditions of the plan
 - vi. Duration of the protocol
 - vii. Intellectual property
 - viii. Differences between the parties

- viii. Differences between the parties
- ix. Development of the collaboration project
- x. Project and/or program to be carried out
- xi. Financial budget
- xii. Reference to the subject of medical insurance and information.

12. CONFIDENTIALITY

- a) Each of the parties accepts and declares that every information from the other party is of a confidential nature, is the exclusive property of the latter and has been or will be disclosed to the former solely with the purpose of enabling the full accomplishment of the present Agreement. For this reason, every piece of information provided by one party to the other before signing this Agreement and/or during its performance must be kept confidential and therefore may not be disclosed to any third parties.

13. AMENDMENTS

The parties may amend or amplify this Agreement through agreements in writing to that effect. Said amendments or additions will be binding on the signatories as of the date of their signature. The parties may not assign, in whole or in part, the performance of the present MoU to any third party, except through prior and express authorization in writing by both of them.

B.) The Second Party in compliance of E-Waste (Management & Handling) Rules, 2016 and its Amendments, desires to have services for management of their Electronic Waste except liquid waste



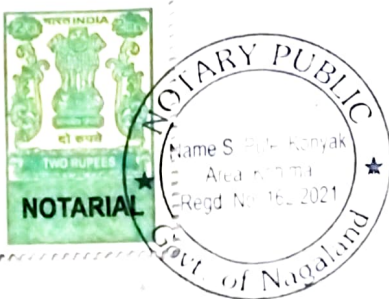

That, relying on the principle of good faith, by virtue of which they will carry out all the possible actions for their due fulfillment,

NOW THEREFORE THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS

1. OBJECTIVE:

can be recognized afterwards.

- b) Students, interns and officers shall be responsible for requesting and obtaining lodging by inquiring with the host institution, which shall provide every help necessary for them to obtain safe, convenient lodging arrangements.
- c) Financial expenses for (term visits) internships of professors and researchers, which will be arranged at the parties' request, as well as travel expenses, shall be covered by the requesting institution. 5. NO EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP:

- a) Credits and grades shall be awarded in accordance with the academic achievement policies in force at the Institution/Affiliating University/Government. However, the Institution reserves the right to accept or reject any accreditation leading to an academic degree.
- b) The Institution shall issue a certification recognizing the grades obtained, as well as the hours invested on projects/papers completed by the students.
- c) It is noted that 6(a) and 6(b) are subject to the laws of the land, and rules and regulations promulgated by the affiliating university, if any, regarding the academic administration as well as transfer of academic credits.

7. RIGHTS AND DUTIES:

- a) The Host Institution is committed to counseling and supporting students on exchange through advice on academic and administrative procedures, as well as to foster their integration, inviting and encouraging guest students to become involved in student life.
- b) The institutions shall act as facilitators, but they will have no obligation whatsoever in terms of the actions, behaviours or financial aspects of the students/participants involved in the exchange.
- c) The students/participants shall enjoy the same rights and privileges as regular students/faculty, and shall observe the norms and rules of the Host Institution and the Host State. Any violation of the laws of the receiving State and/or the rules of the Host Institution by an exchange participant shall be grounds for the immediate termination of

the privileges in the context of this Agreement.

8. AUTONOMY:

- a) This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any financial obligations between the subscribing institutions.

9. TERM:

- a) This MoU shall be effective for a period of five (5) years from the date of execution of this agreement, and shall be automatically renewed thereafter for another five (5) years unless a written notice to terminate or amend this agreement is given to the other party six (6) months in advance.
- b) It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration program. Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly set forth in the action plans.

10. CONFLICT RESOLUTION:

- a) Any dispute resulting from the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled through direct negotiation and common agreement by the persons delegated to such end by each Institution. Either party may propose to the other a modification of the Agreement at anytime in writing.

11. ACTION PLANS:

- a) Every work program or specific activity that is agreed upon between both institutions shall be defined through an action plan, which shall be under the responsibility of two individuals, appointed respectively by each university/Institution, and which shall define the following aspects:
 - i. Foundations or considerations that warrant the plan for inter-institutional collaboration;
 - ii. Objective of the action plan for inter-institutional collaboration;
 - iii. General conditions of the plan;
 - iv. Academic conditions of the plan;
 - v. Administrative and organizational conditions of the plan;
 - vi. Duration of the protocol;
 - vii. Intellectual property;
 - viii. Differences between the parties;
 - ix. Development of the collaboration project;

- x. Project and/or program to be carried out;
- xi. Financial budget;
- xii. Reference to the subject of medical insurance and information.

12. CONFIDENTIALITY:

a) Each of the parties accepts and declares that every information from the other party is of a confidential nature, is the exclusive property of the latter and has been or will be disclosed to the former solely with the purpose of enabling the full accomplishment of the present Agreement. For this reason, every piece of information provided by one party to the other before signing this Agreement and/or during its performance must be kept confidential and therefore may not be disclosed to any third parties.

13. AMENDMENTS:

The parties may amend or amplify this Agreement through agreements in writing to that effect. Said amendments or additions will be binding on the signatories as of the date of their signature. The parties may not assign, in whole or in part, the performance of the present MoU to any third party, except through prior and express authorization in writing by both of them.



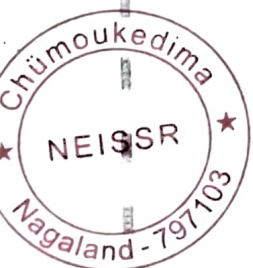

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MoU") is entered on the 26th Day of July, 2022 ("Execution Date") by and amongst:

North East Institute of Social Sciences and Research (NEISSR), Dimapur-Nagaland, India represented by its Principal, Dr. Fr. C.P Anto (Hereinafter referred to as the "FIRST PARTY")

AND

St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) as SJC, Jakhama-Nagaland, India represented by its Principal, Dr. Fr. George Keduolhou Angami, having its address at P.B No.39, Kohima-Nagaland, 797001 (Hereinafter referred to as the "SECOND PARTY")

The institutions (NEISSR and SJC) to this Agreement may hereinafter be individually referred to as the "the **Institution**" and collectively as "the **Institutions**")

WHEREAS,

The Institutions, subject to the terms of this MoU and the laws, rules, regulations and national policies from time to time in force in the country, will endeavor to strengthen, promote and develop cooperation between the Institutions based on equality and mutual benefit.

WHEREAS,

In accordance with a mutual desire, the purpose of this agreement is to establish a framework within which academic, research, scientific cooperation and continuing education may develop between **North East Institute of Social Sciences and Research (NEISSR), Dimapur, Nagaland, India,** and **St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) as SJC, Jakhama - Nagaland, India** and have come to an agreement to collaborate to achieve the following objectives:

Whereas this agreement shall be identified as the parent of any specific programme agreements between the parties. The parties to this agreement indicate their willingness in principle to cooperate in the promotion of teaching and research activities subject to entering into a separate legal agreement where applicable. Under this agreement the types of cooperation may include:

- (1) Students Exchange Programmes
- (2) Collaborative conduct of programmes such as workshop, seminars, conferences etc.
- (3) Staff and Faculty Exchange programmes
- (4) Joint academic programmes
- (5) Collaborative research projects
- (6) Collaborative professional faculty and staff development activities and
- (7) Other activities/programmes as mutually agreed.

1. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

This MoU will not give rise to any financial obligation by one Institution to the other. Each



Institution will bear its own cost and expenses in the implementation of this MoU. Each Institution shall bear the respective costs of carrying out the obligations under this agreement. Neither Institution shall make a claim against the other Institution for any expenditure unless such expenditure has been agreed upon in writing between the Institutions.

2. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

The intellectual property rights shall be enforced by this MoU in conformity with the national rules and regulations.

- 2.1 Both Institutions shall use the other Institution's name or logo in advertisement, promotion, or sales literature within the framework of the MoU in order to promote and encourage the objectives of the agreement. Neither Institution shall assign or purport to assign any right under this agreement without the prior written approval of the other Institution.
- 2.2 Each Institution shall bear the respective costs of carrying out the obligations under this agreement. Neither Institution shall make a claim against the other Institution for any expenditure unless such expenditure has been agreed upon in writing between the Institutions.
- 2.3 Any research publications and intellectual property rights arising out of the students and joint research projects shall be jointly published and, when patented, will be jointly and equally owned by NEISSR and SJC.
- 2.4 The procedural formalities for securing and maintaining the intellectual property rights shall be the responsibility of both NEISSR & SJC and the expenditure incurred thereof shall be borne jointly and equally by NEISSR and SJC.
- 2.5 The upfront fee and royalty accrued from licensing of any intellectual property arising from this collaboration to other Institution shall be shared between the Institutions, the terms and conditions of which shall be the subject matter of a separate agreement between the Institutions. The institutions shall not assign any rights and obligations to any third Institution without written consent of the other party.

3. DESIGNATED AUTHORITIES

The objectives of this MoU will be implemented through the coordination of the Domestic, National and International Offices of both Institutions. The persons designated to coordinate activities under this agreement will be the Director/Coordinator, Office of International, National and Domestic Relations, SJC and the Principal of NEISSR who further can designate/assign coordinators from other departments to implement specific cooperative activities as agreed upon in this MoU.

4. STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

For the purpose of this agreement, the following definitions will be used:

4.1 Student

A student who pays his/her regular tuition fees at "home institution" for the programme/course offered in the institution or receives tuition and fee waiver from the "host institution".



4.2 Home Institution

The educational institution in which a student is formally enrolled as a degree candidate.

4.3 Host Institution

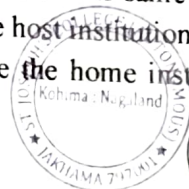
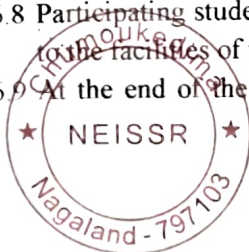
The educational institution that has agreed to host and receive the participants for exchange programme.

4.4 Coordinator

A person designated to coordinate student exchange programmes, oversees the selection of participants (students), facilitates, enrolls and provides assistance to the students for specified programme and serves as liaison between the two Institutions.

5. GUIDELINES

- 5.1 Both institutions, by mutual consent will determine the number of students they may receive in any given year.
- 5.2 The duration of exchange may be finalized upon mutual consent of both the institution.
- 5.3 This exchange is for undergraduate and post-graduate students who have completed at least one year of undergraduate study or one semester of post graduate study, who demonstrate adequate academic preparation, maturity and emotional stability to undertake academic exchange.
- 5.4 Exchange students shall undertake an academic programme at the host institution, whether that host institution is NEISSR or SJC as full time non -degree-seeking students.
- 5.5 The supervision and examination of under-graduate /post-graduate exchange students shall be negotiated on an individual basis by office of the Controller of Examination at NEISSR and SJC.
- 5.6 Exchange student's status and responsibilities:
 - 5.6.1 Exchange students shall register in the courses that their home institutions approve, as long as they do not pose any challenge to the host institution. All students shall maintain full-time enrollment status.
 - 5.6.2 Participating students shall pay all applicable tuition fees at their home institution and the students shall receive these benefits at the host institution without additional charges.
 - 5.6.3 Participating students shall cover the cost of their meals and housing at host institution.
 - 5.6.4 Some classes incur extra cost for materials and/or transportation (some technology classes and some sports classes, for example); in this case, the individual student enrolled in those courses will be required to pay those additional costs.
 - 5.6.5 The home institution shall nominate participating students on the basis of academic merit and other criteria as may be agreed upon by both institutions.
 - 5.6.6 The host institution reserves the right to make final judgment on the admissibility of each student nominated by the home institution.
 - 5.6.7 Participating students shall maintain a full load of study as defined by the host institution. The host institution shall immediately inform the home institution, should the participating student dropout of college or stop attending classes completely.
 - 5.6.8 Participating students shall be given identification cards and shall have the same access to the facilities of the host institution as enjoyed by students of the host institution.
 - 5.6.9 At the end of the study period, the host institution shall provide the home institution

with a transcript report of the courses and grades received by each student not later than six weeks after the last day of the study programme.

6. HOSTING OF SHORT-TERM PROGRAMME

Both institutions agree to help facilitating short-term faculty-led programs in their institutions. The purpose of the short-term program will be in assisting a batch of students either from NEISSR or SJC to do short term programme/certificate programme/enrichment programme in the host institution. The programme will be designed by home institution and subsequently approved by host institution. The arrangement may include facilitating housing, meals, transportation, cultural excursions, guest lectures, expert talks, classroom sessions, meetings at relevant organizations, orientation and advice on health and safety precautions, and general on-site orientation.

The following are mutually agreed as part of Short-term exchange Programme:

- 6.1 The maximum number of students for academic related programmes, workshops, seminars, conferences shall be decided by the two parties as and when needed.
- 6.2 If and when needed a faculty member(s) shall accompany the students for the programmes.
- 6.3 The logistics of the programme shall be discussed mutually and agreed upon by both parties.
- 6.4 The institutions shall bear respective financial expenses related to student exchange programmes, housing, food, transportation, cultural excursion etc.
- 6.5 The host institution shall meet the remunerations/expenses of resource persons who are not staff in the two MoU institutions.
- 6.6 The host institution shall take care of attendance and provide certificates to the resource persons and participants of the programme.

7. FACULTY/STAFF EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

- 7.1 Whenever feasible both NEISSR and SJC agree to engage their respective faculty /staff in short-term exchange for teaching or collaborative project activities.
- 7.2 Financial resources for the implementation of the faculty/staff exchange activities are dependent upon financial availability at each institution and externally generated funds. Neither party is obligated to spend any resources in connection with this faculty/staff exchange.
- 7.3 The specific nature of the faculty/staff exchange may vary; however, unless otherwise noted, the following arrangement shall be made:
 - 7.3.1 The host institution agrees to provide housing for exchange faculty/staff.
 - 7.3.2 While participating in the exchange programme, the visiting faculty /staff shall continue to receive salary and benefits from the home institution.
 - 7.3.3 The home institution or the visiting faculty or staff shall be responsible for arranging and covering the cost of transportation to the host institution.
 - 7.3.4 The period of the exchange visit of any faculty/staff shall not exceed one semester or six months.
 - 7.3.5 Exchange faculty/staff shall be subject to the host institution's rules, regulations, and policies. The host institution will orient exchange faculty/staff to pertinent rules. An exchange faculty/staff member accused of violating rules or policies shall have same



due process right accorded to faculty and staff at the host institution. The home institution shall withdraw the faculty/staff member from the exchange assignment upon request by the host institution.

- 7.3.6 The parties agree that this Agreement shall not be opposed in any manner as establishing any kind of partnership or bond of a labor nature between them. Thus, in all activities stemming from the present MoU and from subsequent specific action plans, the parties are in the understanding that, in all cases, employment relationships shall remain in force between the employing institution and its respective personnel.

8. CONFIDENTIALITY

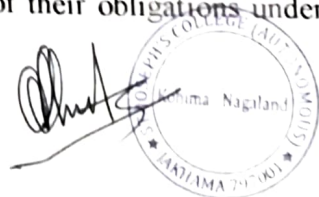
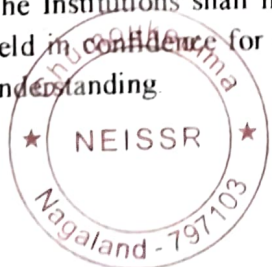

- 10.2 The themes of joint activities, the conditions for utilizing the results achieved, and arrangements for specific visits, exchanges and forms of cooperation shall be negotiated for each specific case and agreed by both parties under this MoU before implementation.
- 10.3 All joint activities not completed at the expiration or termination of this agreement may be continued until their completion under the terms of this understanding.
- 10.4 No amendment or modification of the MoU shall be valid unless the same is made in writing by both the Institutions and specifically stating the same to be an amendment of the MoU. The modifications/changes shall become part of the MoU and shall be effective from the date on which they are made/ executed unless otherwise agreed to.
- 10.5 The Institutions shall not use any of the confidential information which is required to be held in confidence for any purpose other than performance of their obligations under this understanding.



- 10.6 The relationship of the Institutions under this understanding shall be non-exclusive and both Institutions are free to pursue other agreements or collaborations of any kind
- 10.7 This MoU serves only as a record of the institutions' intentions and does not constitute and is not intended to constitute or create obligations under domestic or international law and will not give rise to any legal process and will not be deemed to constitute or create any legally binding or enforceable obligations, express or implied
- 10.8 Co-operation and development of activities may be extended to any fields and subjects in which both Institutions identify shared interests.
- 10.9 Both the Institutions shall designate the coordinators who will be responsible for co-operation and implementation of this agreement.
- 10.10 The two Institutions recognize that this collaboration establishes a foundation of mutual understanding and interest and does not in itself entail any legal and/or financial obligations for either party.



MOU for the Installation of ATM

And relying also on their common bonds and concerns, they state their interest in strengthening their relationships through academic cooperation, and for this end they are of one accord in entering this MoU.

1. OBJECTIVE

4. FUNDING

- a) Expenses for airfare, transportation, room and board and personal expenses of exchange students, teachers or officers shall be covered by each individual. Students will pay their registration and for courses or professional practices at their home institution, so that they can be recognized afterwards.
- b) Students, interns and officers shall be responsible for requesting and obtaining lodging by inquiring with the host institution, which shall provide every help necessary for them to obtain safe, convenient lodging arrangements.
- c) Financial expenses for (term visits) internships of professors and researchers, which will be arranged at the parties' request, as well as travel expenses, shall be covered by the requesting institution. No fees will be paid, as the assumption is that the professors/researchers remain in their positions at their home institution, which will continue to pay their salaries.

5. NO EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP

The parties agree that this Agreement shall not be construed in any manner as establishing any kind of partnership or bond of a labour nature between them. Thus, in all activities stemming from the present MoU and from subsequent specific action plans, the parties are in the understanding that, in all cases, employment relationships shall remain in force between the employing institution and its respective personnel.

6. CREDITS/ACCREDITATION

- a) Credits and grades shall be awarded in accordance with the academic achievement policies in force at the Institution/Affiliating University/Government. However, the Institution reserves the right to accept or reject any accreditation leading to an academic degree.
- b) The Institution shall issue a certification recognizing the grades obtained, as well as the hours invested on projects/papers completed by the students.
- c) It is noted that 6(a) and 6(b) are subject to the laws of the land, and rules and regulations promulgated by the affiliating university, if any, regarding the academic administration as well as transfer of academic credits.

7. RIGHTS AND DUTIES

 - v. Administrative and organizational conditions of the plan
 - vi. Duration of the protocol
 - vii. Intellectual property

- viii. Differences between the parties
- ix. Development of the collaboration project
- x. Project and/or program to be carried out
- xi. Financial budget
- xii. Reference to the subject of medical insurance and information.

11. CONFIDENTIALITY

- a) Each of the parties accepts and declares that every information from the other party is of a confidential nature, is the exclusive property of the latter and has been or will be disclosed to the former solely with the purpose of enabling the full accomplishment of the present Agreement. For this reason, every piece of information provided by one party to the other before signing this Agreement and/or during its performance must be kept confidential and therefore may not be disclosed to any third parties.

12. AMENDMENTS:

The parties may amend or amplify this Agreement through agreements in writing to that effect. Said amendments or additions will be binding on the signatories as of the date of their signature. The parties may not assign, in whole or in part, the performance of the present MoU to any third party, except through prior and express authorization in writing by both of them.

AND WHEREAS, given the mission of the (Name of the College / Institution / University) and IGNOU in the spheres of education and their interests in teaching and research in the field of distance and open learning, the Parties herein above agree and undertake towards each other to offer programmes under Distance Education System with the Learner Support Centres (LSC) for such academic programmes identified and activated at the LSC as agreed upon.

THAT, both the parties have agreed upon the terms and conditions governing their relationship for their co-operation to provide educational opportunities to communities at large.

NOW THEREFORE, IN VIEW OF THE FOREGOING PROMISES AND IN FURTHER CONSIDERATION OF MUTUAL COVENANTS HEREIN CONTAINED, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS GIVEN UNDER:

1. OBLIGATIONS OF THE "HOST INSTITUTION" :

(i). Physical Infrastructure Requirements:
The Host Institution will :

- (a). Provide minimum three to four rooms with space of approx. 400-600 square feet with required furniture and equipment exclusively for office use of IGNOU, (for office of Coordinator and for storing records, assignments, printed materials etc.) without charging any rent;
- (b). Provide class rooms with required furniture which can be used for holding academic counselling sessions as per academic calendar of IGNOU, without charging any rent;
- (c). Extend the use of Laboratory and Computer to IGNOU Learners for specialized programmes requiring use of institutional infrastructure facilities as per IGNOU norms;
- (d). Extend facilities for use of library to IGNOU learners for reference purposes;
- (e). Provide space at a prominent place for installing IGNOU signboard;

(ii). Digital / Online Requirements:
The Host Institution will:

- (a). Provide/Share adequate number of Computers, Printers, scanner, Internet facility, Web Cam, LCD Projector, high speed broad band, for office use and for facilitating processing of online assignment system and other online support activities of IGNOU;
- (b). Provide a full fledged computer lab equipped with computers, internet, broadband facilities to facilitate processing of online assignment system and other online activities of IGNOU as per requirements of study for the university programmes ;
- (c). Provide/Share Online / DTH facilities for access to Gyan Darshan / Gyan Vani transmissions;

(iii). Manpower Requirements:

The Head of the Host Institution will:

- (a). Recommend a panel of three names of senior most academics from among the regular academics to IGNOU for engagement as part time Coordinator, not below the rank of Assistant Professor, for coordinating and managing all the activities of IGNOU;

- (b). Allow the Coordinator to engage Assistant Coordinators and other part time staff drawn from the regular staff of the host institution and as per IGNOU norms;
- (c) Assume the charge of Coordinator in case there is no Assistant Coordinator and Coordinator is unavailable during intermittent periods as an interim arrangement;
- (d) Allow its faculty for empanelment as Academic Counselor of IGNOU;
- (e) Carry out distribution of study material provided by the Material Production and Distribution Division, IGNOU as per IGNOU norms;

(iv). Learner Grievance Redressal Mechanism:

The Host institution will have in place a dedicated helpdesk with a dedicated staff for addressing all learner grievances received at the LSC in person, by post or through email.

2. **OBLIGATIONS OF IGNOU:**

- (i). Convey the approval of engagement of part time Coordinator from the panel recommended by the Head of Host Institution and pay monthly honorarium at the prescribed rates of the University;
- (ii). Empanel part time Academic Counsellors/Evaluator as per specified nomenclature, and make payment of remuneration to them as per IGNOU norms;
- (iii). Convey the approval of engagement of part time staff on the basis of recommendation of the Coordinator and pay remuneration as per IGNOU norms;
- (iv). Will pay hiring charges towards the use of Computers/Laboratory / Equipment /Consumables (provided they are used by learners) for programme requirements as per IGNOU norms;
- (v). Will pay the hiring charges to the LSC for the use of computers and computer accessories for IGNOU activities used by the host institution as per IGNOU norms;
- (vi) Will pay handling charges for the distribution of study materials to learners as prescribed by the university (if required);
- (vii). Monitor and supervise and visit the LSC at any time to ensure that LSC under this MOU are being run as per standards of IGNOU;

3.1 **EFFECTIVE DATE, DURATION & TERMINATION:**

- (i). This MOU shall enter into force from 7th March 2021 (Here-in-after referred to as the "**Effective Date**") and shall be valid for a period of Five (05) years ending on 7th March 2026 with the option of renewal. The term of this MOU may be further renewed on terms and conditions mutually agreed upon and recorded in writing between the Parties. The processes of renewal must necessarily be started six months before the termination date. However, students admitted to any programme during the period of validity of this MOU will be enabled to complete their programmes of study and appear in the relevant examinations, and the obligations of the respective

Parties will continue to be in force during such period irrespective of termination of the agreement.

- (ii). Either party may terminate this MOU by providing the other party with Six Calendar Months advance notice. Such termination shall take effect at the end of the six month period ;
- (iii). However, either party shall be entitled to terminate this MOU immediately and without further notice in the event of the other party committing a material breach of the terms and conditions of this MOU, and failing to remedy such breach within 30 (Thirty) days after the receipt of written notice calling upon such party to remedy the breach complained of ;
- (iv). The termination of this MOU, for whatever reason, will not affect the rights of a party, which might have accrued at the date of termination and will further not affect any rights, which specifically or by their nature survive the termination of this MOU ;

3.2 FORCE MAJEURE :

- (i). Neither IGNOU nor (Name of the College / Institution / University) shall be liable to each other or to their students for failing or delay in the performance of any of its obligations under this AGREEMENT or the time over to the extent such failure or delay is caused by riots, civil commotion, war, hostilities between nations, government laws, orders or regulations, embargoes, actions by the government or any agency thereof, acts of God, storms, fires accidents, strikes, sabotages, explosions, or other similar or different contingencies beyond the reasonable control of the respective Parties.
- (ii). In the event that either party is, wholly or in part, prevented from or hindered in carrying out or observing any of the terms or conditions of this agreement for any cause set forth herein this MOU, such party shall give written notice to the other party by the most expeditious means as soon as possible after and occurrence of the cause relied on, giving full particulars of the reason for such prevention, or hindrance, and the Parties shall in good faith consult each other and take necessary measures for the resolution of the affairs so prevented or hindered.

3.3 AMENDMENT OF MOU :

- (i). The obligations of IGNOU and (Name of the College / Institution / University) have been outlined in this MOU. However during the operation of the MOU, circumstances may arise which may call for alterations or modifications of this MOU. These modifications / alterations will be mutually discussed and endorsed in the form of an "Appendix or Addendum to the MOU". These modifications / alterations will be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing and shall be effective only if executed by the respective duly authorized representatives of each of the Parties hereto;

- (ii). No Amendment for change hereof or addition hereto shall be effective or binding on either of the parties hereto unless set in writing and executed by the respective duly authorized representatives of each of the parties hereto;

3.4 INDEMNITY CLAUSE:

- (i). (Name of the College / Institution / University) has agreed to bear the responsibility for any third party claims, demands, proceedings, prosecutions, or actions against IGNOU, arising out of and as a result of any callous, negligent, deficient action or omission by any employee of (Name of the College / Institution / University) and has undertaken to keep IGNOU indemnified against all losses and damages suffered including expenses incurred by IGNOU while defending the claim (inclusive of legal expenses) in City, or any other court as a result of any such claim, demands, proceedings, prosecutions or actions.
- (ii). The Parties have agreed that this provision shall survive termination of the agreement and the (Name of the Institution) has agreed to clear the amounts claimed by IGNOU under this clause within 15 days from the date when the demand is made by IGNOU.

3.5 NO PARTNERSHIP :

- (i). Nothing in this MOU shall be deemed to neither constitute or create an Association, Trust, Partnership or a Joint Venture between the parties nor constitute any Party the agent of any other Party for any purpose. Neither this MOU, nor any activities described herein, shall be construed as creating a Partnership, Joint Venture, Franchise, Agency or other such relationship. Neither Party is authorized, in any manner, to make any commitment on behalf of or to bind the other Party ;
- (ii). The Parties shall ensure compliance with all statutory provisions applicable to and governing the employment of its employees and representatives, deployed and would ensure compliance to provisions of statutes, as amended and applicable from time to time for such employees and representatives. Under no circumstances shall employees, agents and representatives of either party, represent as or be construed as employees / agents of the other party to this MOU. Neither party shall enter into any independent arrangements with the other party's employees ;

3.6 DISPUTE RESOLUTION :

If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever may arise between the Parties in connection with or arising out of this agreement or out of the breach, termination or invalidity of the agreement hereof, the Parties shall resolve them by resorting to the following order as mentioned :

- (i). The (Name of the College / Institution / University) and IGNOU shall attempt for a period of 30 days after receipt of notice by the other party of the

existence of a dispute to settle such dispute in the first instance by mutual discussions between the Parties.

- (ii). If the dispute cannot be settled by mutual discussions within 30 days as provided herein, the dispute shall be referred to the sole arbitration of any arbitrator appointed by the Vice-Chancellor of IGNOU. The Party having a grievance shall serve a written notice by registered acknowledgement due post on the other party intimating its intention of invoking the arbitration clause and shall simultaneously serve a notice in the similar mode on the Vice-Chancellor, IGNOU requesting them to appoint an arbitrator.
- (iii). The arbitration proceedings shall be held in accordance with the provisions of Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 of India or any statutory modification or re-enactment thereof.
- (iv). The arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in the English Language. The venue of arbitration shall be New Delhi.
- (v). The payment to be made to the arbitrator shall be shared equally between the two Parties. All other expenses incurred by each party relating to the arbitration proceedings shall be borne by the respective Parties.
- (vi). Judgement upon any award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered in any Court in India, having competent jurisdiction in relation thereto or the application may be made to such court for a judicial acceptance or recognition of the award and announcements orders enforcement (Including specific performance), as the case may be.

3.7 PUBLICITY :

Any publicity by either Party, in which the name of other Party is to be used shall be done only with the explicit written permission of the other Party and after the contents of the same are vetted / approved by the other Party. If either Party, to do so, it shall be considered a breach of the MOU.

3.8 PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE :

(Name of the College / Institution / University) & IGNOU shall always act in respect of any matter relating to this MOU, as faithful advisors to each other and shall, at all times, support and safeguard the legitimate interests of each other in any dealings with the third Party.

3.9 GOVERNING LAW (S) & JURISDICTION :

The MOU shall be governed and interpreted by, and construed in accordance with the substantive laws of India. All disputes, differences, claims and demands arising under or pursuant to or touching upon this MOU shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Courts of Delhi / New Delhi.

3.10 INTERPRETATION :

This agreement has been executed in the English and the English language that be the controlling language for interpretation thereof. No other translation, if any, of this AGREEMENT into other languages shall be of any force or effect in the interpretation of this AGREEMENT or in determination of the intent of either of the Parties hereto.

3.11 REPRESENTATION & WARRANTIES :

The (Name of the College / Institution / University) and IGNOU hereby represent and warrant to each other :

- (i). It has the power and authority to sign this AGREEMENT, perform and comply with its duties and obligations under this AGREEMENT.
- (ii). This AGREEMENT constitutes legal, valid and binding obligations enforceable against it in accordance with the terms hereof.
- (iii). The execution, delivery and performance of this AGREEMENT have been duly authorized by all requisite actions and will not constitute a violation of :
 - (a). Any statute, judgement, order decree or regulation of any court, governmental instrumentality or arbitral tribunal applicable or relating to itself, its assets or its functions ; or
 - (b). Any other documents or to the best of its knowledge any indenture, contract or agreement to which it is a party or by which it may be bound.
- (iv). There are no suits or proceedings pending to the best of knowledge threatened against it before any court, government instrumentality or arbitration tribunal that restrain it from performing its duties and obligations under this AGREEMENT, and
- (v). That no representation or warranty made herein contains any untrue statement.

3.12 SEVERABILITY :

Any law restraining the validity and enforceability of any provision of this agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining provisions hereof and this agreement shall be deemed as not containing the invalid provisions. The remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in full force and effect, unless the invalid or unenforceable provision comprises an integral part of or otherwise is inseparable from the remaining agreement. In such a case, the Parties to this agreement shall attempt to agree on a provision which is valid and enforceable and similar to the original provision.

3.13 NOTICES :

(i). Any notice, approval, consent and or other notification required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be in writing in English and shall be personally delivered, or transmitted by registered mail with postage full paid, or transmitted by facsimile (With postage prepaid) to the address specified below or to such address as may, from time to time, be given by each Party to the other Party in writing and in the manner herein before provided :

Any notice or communication made by personal delivery or by courier will be conclusively deemed to have been given on the day of actual delivery or, if made or given by fax or e-mail on the first business day following the transmittal of;

(ii). Any notice, approval, consent and other notification required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be deemed to have been given on the date of receipt when personally delivered, on the date seven (7) days after having been posted when transmitted by registered mail or on the date of transmission with confirmed answer back, when transmitted by facsimile.

3.14 FURTHER ACTS AND ASSURANCES:

Each of the Parties agrees to execute and deliver all such further instruments to do and perform all such further acts and things, as shall be necessary and required to carry out the provisions of this MOU and to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby.

3.15 CONFIDENTIALITY :

(i). Each party shall undertake to the other that it will treat as confidential this collaboration and its terms together with all information whether of a technical nature or otherwise relating to any manner to the business or affairs of the other parties, as may be communicated to it hereunder or otherwise in connection with this collaboration, save as required to be disclosed by any law.

- (ii). Each party shall not disclose to any Third Party any information related to strategies, methodologies, operational information and other confidential information related to each other's plans, Programmes, etc. to any Third Party under any circumstances whatsoever, except with prior written approval of the other Party. Should such information be required to be disclosed by the disclosing party under any laws, rules or regulations or pursuant to the order or direction, of any Court, authority, tribunal or forum, government or regulatory body to whose supervisory authority the receiving Party is subject ; provided that, in any such event, the disclosing Party shall give to the other Party notice in writing as soon as practicable of any disclosure, and the receiving Party shall use its best effort to obtain assurance that the disclosed information will be accorded confidential treatment ;
- (iii). The Parties shall keep confidential and shall not use for any other purpose, each other's information save and except such as is required by the law to be disclosed / divulged. The Parties shall take all reasonable steps to minimize the risk of disclosure of confidential information, by ensuring that only their employees and agents and those whose duties will require them to possess any off such information shall have access thereto, and that Parties shall ensure that such employees and agents and other personnel shall treat the same as confidential.

3.16 COPYRIGHT AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY :

- (i). Copyright in the Course Material (Print, Audio / Video or Soft Copy) shall exclusively be with IGNOU.
- (ii). None of the parties shall use, register or attempt to register any of the intellectual property rights which vests in the other Party, without the prior written permission of such Party ;
- (iii). Any use of the intellectual property right of one Party in course of achieving the objectives shall not be deemed to vest the ownership of intellectual property rights in the other Party. Any unauthorized attempt to use, register or attempt to register any of the intellectual property rights of a Party without express permission of the other Party shall constitute an act of infringement of the intellectual property rights of the said Party ;

3.17 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY :

Neither Party shall be liable for any direct, indirect, incidental, special or consequential damages, or damages for loss of profits, revenue, data or use, incurred by either Party or any third party in connection with this MOU or the subject matter of this MOU, whether in an action in contract or tort or any other legal theory, even if the Party has been advised of the possibility of such damages.





MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is made and entered on the **21st Day of February, 2021** (Execution date) by and amongst:

St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Jakhama, Nagaland represented by its Principal, **Dr. Fr. George Keduolhou Angami**, which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, be deemed to mean and include its authorised representative **Dr. Fr. George Keduolhou Angami & St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Jakhama, Nagaland**, (Hereinafter referred to as the "FIRST PARTY")

And

St. Joseph Higher Secondary School, Viswema, represented by its Principal **Rev. Sr. Lucy Gonmei**, located at Viswema Village, (hereinafter referred to as "SECOND PARTY").

The parties to this Agreement may hereinafter be individually referred to as the "Party" and collectively as "Parties".

WHEREAS,

- a) **St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Jakhama-Nagaland, India**, was established in **1985**, recognized under Sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, accredited by NAAC with A Grade, is a premier constituent college of Nagaland University. FIRSTY PARTY was affiliated to North Eastern Hill University (NEHU), Shillong in 1985 and in 1994 got affiliated to Nagaland University, Lumami. FIRST PARTY is situated in an environmental friendly campus within the jurisdiction of Jakhama Village.

FIRST PARTY offers Under Graduate and Post Graduate programmes in 13 different departments. The College address is P.B No. 39, Kohima–Nagaland, 797001 and the College website is www.https://stjosephjakhama.ac.in. SJC is managed by the Diocese of Kohima under the Chairmanship of the Bishop of Kohima, Nagaland.

- b) **FIRST PARTY** is desirous to associate with **SECOND PARTY** on various areas as discussed in the purview of this MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both institutions.

WHEREAS,

- a) **St. Joseph Higher Secondary School, Viswema**, is a Catholic educational institution managed by the Congregation of the Sisters of the Little flower of Bethany, established on 11th February 1977. The institution provides co-education to the children and helps the children to grow up to be responsible citizens.
- b) **SECOND PARTY** is desirous to associate with **FIRST PARTY** on various areas as discussed in the purview of this MoU, which will be mutually beneficial to both the "Parties".

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing premises and the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to establish a collaborative agreement between the Parties to help, support and render possible service to each other using human resource and technical support.

2. AREAS OF COLLABORATIONS

Whereas, the Parties recognize that the academic collaboration would be of mutual benefit and would provide strengths in research and education and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic cooperation. As per the purpose of the said agreement, the two parties shall:

- i. Joint Faculty Empowerment and Career Development programmes
- ii. Sharing of human resources (faculty) in scholarly pursuits
- iii. Student Development Programmes
- iv. Counselling
- v. Value Education
- vi. Extension Activities/Programmes
- vii. Collaboration in the area of Education and Teacher Training
- viii. Any other area/activities of mutual interest that may emerge in future, after due deliberations and consent of both the parties.

3. AUTONOMY

- a) This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any financial obligations between the subscribing Parties.

4. TERM AND TERMINATION

- a) This MoU shall be effective for a period of five (5) years from the date of execution of this agreement, and shall be automatically renewed thereafter for another five (5) years unless a written notice to terminate or amend this agreement is given to the other party six (6) months in advance.
- b) It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration program. Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly set forth in the action plans.

5. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- a) Any dispute resulting from the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled through direct negotiation and common agreement by the persons delegated to such end by each Party. Either Party may propose to the other a modification of the Agreement at anytime in writing.

That, relying on the principle of good faith, by virtue of which they will carry out all the possible actions for their due fulfillment,

And relying also on their common bonds and concerns, they state their interest in strengthening their relationships through academic cooperation, and for this end they are of one accord in entering this MoU.

NOW THEREFORE THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS

1. OBJECTIVE:

The parties agree that the objective of the present MoU is to establish a cooperation program in order to collaborate towards the formation of students, academics and researchers for the promotion and development of their respective areas of interest.

2. METHOD FOR ACHIEVING THE OBJECTIVES:

In order to achieve the aforementioned objectives, both parties, in mutual agreement, shall develop cooperation programs and projects that will specify the commitments each of them is to make for the performance of said programs.

3. AREAS OF CO-OPERATION:

Whereas, SJC and DBCK recognize that the academic collaboration would be of mutual benefit and would provide strengths in research and education and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic cooperation. As per the purpose of the said agreement, the two parties shall:

- i. Joint Faculty Empowerment and Career Development programmes
- ii. Sharing of human resources (faculty) in scholarly pursuits
- iii. Student Development Programmes
- iv. Counselling
- v. Value Education
- vi. Collaborations for Seminars/Webinars/Workshops
- vii. Extension Activities/Programmes
- viii. Joint Research Projects and Publications
- ix. Collaboration in the area of Education and Teacher Training
- x. Any other area/activities of mutual interest that may emerge in future, after due deliberations and consent of both the parties.

4. FUNDING:

- a) Expenses for airfare, transportation, room and board and personal expenses of exchange students, teachers or officers shall be covered by each individual. Students will pay their registration and for courses or professional practices at their home institution, so that they

can be recognized afterwards.

- b) Students, interns and officers shall be responsible for requesting and obtaining lodging by inquiring with the host institution, which shall provide every help necessary for them to obtain safe, convenient lodging arrangements.
- c) Financial expenses for (term visits) internships of professors and researchers, which will be arranged at the parties' request, as well as travel expenses, shall be covered by the requesting institution. No fees will be paid, as the assumption is that the professors/researchers remain in their positions at their home institution, which will continue to pay their salaries.

5. NO EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP:

The parties agree that this Agreement shall not be construed in any manner as establishing any kind of partnership or bond of a labour nature between them. Thus, in all activities stemming from the present MoU and from subsequent specific action plans, the parties are in the understanding that, in all cases, employment relationships shall remain in force between the employing institution and its respective personnel.

6. CREDITS/ACCREDITATION:

- a) Credits and grades shall be awarded in accordance with the academic achievement policies in force at the Institution/Affiliating University/Government. However, the Institution reserves the right to accept or reject any accreditation leading to an academic degree.
- b) The Institution shall issue a certification recognizing the grades obtained, as well as the hours invested on projects/papers completed by the students.
- c) It is noted that 6(a) and 6(b) are subject to the laws of the land, and rules and regulations promulgated by the affiliating university, if any, regarding the academic administration as well as transfer of academic credits.

7. RIGHTS AND DUTIES:

- a) The Host Institution is committed to counseling and supporting students on exchange through advice on academic and administrative procedures, as well as to foster their integration, inviting and encouraging guest students to become involved in student life.
- b) The institutions shall act as facilitators, but they will have no obligation whatsoever in terms of the actions, behaviours or financial aspects of the students/participants involved in the exchange.
- c) The students/participants shall enjoy the same rights and privileges as regular students/faculty, and shall observe the norms and rules of the Host Institution and the Host State. Any violation of the laws of the receiving State and/or the rules of the Host Institution by an exchange participant shall be grounds for the immediate termination of

the privileges in the context of this Agreement.

8. AUTONOMY:

- a) This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any financial obligations between the subscribing institutions.

9. TERM:

- a) This MoU shall be effective for a period of five (5) years from the date of execution of this agreement, and shall be automatically renewed thereafter for another five (5) years unless a written notice to terminate or amend this agreement is given to the other party six (6) months in advance.
- b) It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration program. Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly set forth in the action plans.

10. CONFLICT RESOLUTION:

- a) Any dispute resulting from the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled through direct negotiation and common agreement by the persons delegated to such end by each Institution. Either party may propose to the other a modification of the Agreement at anytime in writing.

11. ACTION PLANS:

- a) Every work program or specific activity that is agreed upon between both institutions shall be defined through an action plan, which shall be under the responsibility of two individuals, appointed respectively by each university/Institution, and which shall define the following aspects:
 - i. Foundations or considerations that warrant the plan for inter-institutional collaboration;
 - ii. Objective of the action plan for inter-institutional collaboration;
 - iii. General conditions of the plan;
 - iv. Academic conditions of the plan;
 - v. Administrative and organizational conditions of the plan;
 - vi. Duration of the protocol;
 - vii. Intellectual property;
 - viii. Differences between the parties;
 - ix. Development of the collaboration project;
 - x. Project and/or program to be carried out;
 - xi. Financial budget;
 - xii. Reference to the subject of medical insurance and information.


12. CONFIDENTIALITY:

- a) Each of the parties accepts and declares that every information from the other party is of a confidential nature, is the exclusive property of the latter and has been or will be disclosed to the former solely with the purpose of enabling the full accomplishment of the present Agreement. For this reason, every piece of information provided by one party to the other before signing this Agreement and/or during its performance must be kept confidential and therefore may not be disclosed to any third parties.

13. AMENDMENTS:

The parties may amend or amplify this Agreement through agreements in writing to that effect. Said amendments or additions will be binding on the signatories as of the date of their signature. The parties may not assign, in whole or in part, the performance of the present MoU to any third party, except through prior and express authorization in writing by both of them.

And since both parties are in agreement regarding the content of the present document, and as a token of conformity, we sign it in two counterparts, both of which will be considered originals.





The above said courses shall be conducted by **EMPORIUM TRAINING & CONSULTANCY PVT LTD** AT the infrastructure provided/designated/nominated/allocated by **SJC**, in its college campus, daily/weekly for 2 hours per day as per the convenience of the college.

1.0 **ADMISSION PROCEDURES**

- (a) **The ETCPL** shall furnish details of eligibility conditions for the course and request **SJC** to invite applications.
- (b) Both the parties will jointly screen the applications and conduct counseling of the eligible applicants.
- (c) Registrations for the course applied for shall be completed at least one week (1 Week) before the course commencement.

1.1 **Vocational Training Programme – Study Materials**

3.7 SJC shall provide boarding & lodging facilities to the trainers/faculties/mentors deputed by ETCPL for conducting skill training program at SJC, Jakhama.

NOW THEREFORE THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS

1. OBJECTIVE:

The parties agree that the objective of the present MoU is to establish a cooperation program in order to collaborate towards the formation of students, academics and researchers for the promotion and development of their respective areas of interest.

2. METHOD FOR ACHIEVING THE OBJECTIVES:

In order to achieve the aforementioned objectives, both parties, in mutual agreement, shall develop cooperation programs and projects that will specify the commitments each of them is to make for the performance of said programs.

3. AREAS OF CO-OPERATION:

Whereas, SJC and C-Edge recognize that the academic collaboration would be of mutual benefit and would provide strengths in research and education and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic cooperation. As per the purpose of the said agreement, the two parties shall:

- i. Joint Faculty Empowerment and Career Development programmes
- ii. Sharing of human resources (faculty) in scholarly pursuits
- iii. Student Development Programmes
- iv. Counselling
- v. Value Education
- vi. Collaborations for Seminars/Webinars/Workshops
- vii. Extension Activities/Programmes
- viii. Joint Research Projects and Publications
- ix. Collaboration in the area of Education and Teacher Training
- x. Any other area/activities of mutual interest that may emerge in future, after due deliberations and consent of both the parties.

4. FUNDING:

- a) Expenses for airfare, transportation, room and board and personal expenses of exchange students, teachers or officers shall be covered by each individual. Students will pay their registration and for courses or professional practices at their home institution, so that they

- can be recognized afterwards.
- b) Students, interns and officers shall be responsible for requesting and obtaining lodging by inquiring with the host institution, which shall provide every help necessary for them to obtain safe, convenient lodging arrangements.
 - c) Financial expenses for (term visits) internships of professors and researchers, which will be arranged at the parties' request, as well as travel expenses, shall be covered by the requesting institution. No fees will be paid, as the assumption is that the professors/researchers remain in their positions at their home institution, which will continue to pay their salaries.

5. NO EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP:

The parties agree that this Agreement shall not be construed in any manner as establishing any kind of partnership or bond of a labour nature between them. Thus, in all activities stemming from the present MoU and from subsequent specific action plans, the parties are in the understanding that, in all cases, employment relationships shall remain in force between the employing institution and its respective personnel.

6. CREDITS/ACCREDITATION:

- a) Credits and grades shall be awarded in accordance with the academic achievement policies in force at the Institution/Affiliating University/Government. However, the Institution reserves the right to accept or reject any accreditation leading to an academic degree.
- b) The Institution shall issue a certification recognizing the grades obtained, as well as the hours invested on projects/papers completed by the students.
- c) It is noted that 6(a) and 6(b) are subject to the laws of the land, and rules and regulations promulgated by the affiliating university, if any, regarding the academic administration as well as transfer of academic credits.

7. RIGHTS AND DUTIES:

- a) The Host Institution is committed to counseling and supporting students on exchange through advice on academic and administrative procedures, as well as to foster their integration, inviting and encouraging guest students to become involved in student life.
- b) The institutions shall act as facilitators, but they will have no obligation whatsoever in terms of the actions, behaviours or financial aspects of the students/participants involved in the exchange.
- c) The students/participants shall enjoy the same rights and privileges as regular students/faculty, and shall observe the norms and rules of the Host Institution and the Host State. Any violation of the laws of the receiving State and/or the rules of the Host Institution by an exchange participant shall be grounds for the immediate termination of

the privileges in the context of this Agreement.

8. AUTONOMY:

- a) This agreement is a statement of intentions and does not involve, in any instance whatsoever, any financial obligations between the subscribing institutions.

9. TERM:

- a) This MoU shall be effective from the date of execution of this agreement, and shall remain operative unless a written notice to terminate or amend this agreement is given to the other party six (6) months in advance.
- b) It is expressly agreed that neither party shall be liable for damages that they might cause each other as a result of a forceful suspension of a collaboration program. Causes for forceful suspension must be explicitly set forth in the action plans.

10. CONFLICT RESOLUTION:

- a) Any dispute resulting from the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled through direct negotiation and common agreement by the persons delegated to such end by each Institution. Either party may propose to the other a modification of the Agreement at anytime in writing.

11. ACTION PLANS:

- a) Every work program or specific activity that is agreed upon between both institutions shall be defined through an action plan, which shall be under the responsibility of two individuals, appointed respectively by each university/Institution, and which shall define the following aspects:
 - i. Foundations or considerations that warrant the plan for inter-institutional collaboration;
 - ii. Objective of the action plan for inter-institutional collaboration;
 - iii. General conditions of the plan;
 - iv. Academic conditions of the plan;
 - v. Administrative and organizational conditions of the plan;
 - vi. Duration of the protocol;
 - vii. Intellectual property;
 - viii. Differences between the parties;
 - ix. Development of the collaboration project;
 - x. Project and/or program to be carried out;
 - xi. Financial budget;
 - xii. Reference to the subject of medical insurance and information.

12. CONFIDENTIALITY:

- a) Each of the parties accepts and declares that every information from the other party is of a confidential nature, is the exclusive property of the latter and has been or will be disclosed to the former solely with the purpose of enabling the full accomplishment of the present Agreement. For this reason, every piece of information provided by one party to the other before signing this Agreement and/or during its performance must be kept confidential and therefore may not be disclosed to any third parties.

13. AMENDMENTS:



- Support Telcocrats in required branding of the infrastructure as per Scheme Guidelines
- Internal Branding: Charts/flex displaying the program name, Telcocrats Logo and **(College name)** Logo.
- Office Working Space for Our Admin work , Enrollment & Counseling
- Providing Telcocrats Trainer (or visitor before training) facilities such as:
 - Accommodation & Food till training session and examination
- Share Data of candidates available with college that is not required or useful for the college.
- SPOC for Data enrollment.
- SPOC for collecting your student document for enrolling them.
- SPOC for Mobilization of candidates.
- SPOC for Placements of Trained Candidate.
- Provide faculty for training support and ensuring proper attendance of trainees.
- Ensure above 85% Attendance of all the trainees
- Appoint a Responsible Coordinator for this MOU Activity and Accountability.

NODAL AUTHORITY

The Nodal authority from **College** shall be the _____ or his nominee and the Nodal authority from **Telcocrats technologies** shall be **Mr Kapil Bhutani** or his nominee for decision making and concurrence on matters of mutual interest under this MoU.

EXCLUSIVENESS:

- Infra Partner will exclusively work for the agreed skill development sectors and programs with the Skill Development Agency to avoid any conflict of interest as well as to encourage brand building and long term continued business .

CONFIDENTIALITY:

- Parties to the AGREEMENT have expressly agreed to hold the entire information and documents related to this program as strictly confidential. Each Party, shall, upon request of the other Party, return all materials, details, documents and records in possession of the Party at the time of termination of this AGREEMENT that were provided by the other Party and shall destroy all the related materials and softcopies/electronic devices etc. and shall furnish a declaration to that effect.

IMPLEMENTATION AND ACTION PLAN:

DISPUTE RESOLUTION:



Responsibilities of the parties


