

knowledge and wisdom.





Five teachers and 150 students from the department visited Jo Foundation Inclusive School Agri Colony Kohima on 6th May 2023. During the short program conducted at the school the Administrator of the school, Miss Kheyokhole Ltu gave a brief sharing on the school and why it is important to have an inclusive school while Mrs. Alibo Achumi, Assistant Professor SJC(A) spoke on the vision and purpose of the Sociology gives back initiative. While acknowledging the efforts of the students, she also stated that this initiative is one of the best practises of their department.

She added that over the years, the department was able to help many NGOs, namely, bright morning Star orphanage, Akumdong welfare fund for cancer Patient, cradle Ridge for HIV aids patient, old age home, Youth Net, operation rescue, Nagaland, cancer patients in Naga Hospital, people, living below poverty line, orphans, with us and destitutes in Jakhama Village, poor students and parents of a department and 4th gade staffs of St. Joseph College and many more.

This year they identified three beneficiaries based on their needs, visions and missions. They were

- 1. Miss Imkonglemla, a 6th semester student of their own department suffering from fourth stage breast cancer. A sum of Rs.15.000 was donated towards her treatment.
- 2. The Miraculum society, Nagaland. A recently formed NGO founded by a student of their own department again Miss Vikuonuo Sachu, who was also former Miss Nagaland in 2020-2021, whose vision was to work for child support, education, youth empowerment and community development. A sum of Rs.25,000 was donated towards the NGO and
- 3. Thirdly, the Jo Foundation inclusive school that started with a vision to care and nurture the differently abled children and integrate them with normal society, empowered with skills and knowledge to face any challenges that comes their way. A sum of Rs. 50,000 was donated towards the school infrastructural development fund.

Ms. Thejanguno Lese presented a special performance during the programme representing the department and a special song was also presented by the students of Jo Foundation Inclusive School. Miss Vikuonuo Sachu introduced her NGO The Miraculum Society to the School and the members present in the programme and highlighted about the nature of the work and charity project the NGO is currently undertaking. The team further headed to Botanical Garden, Kohima for the lunch.

Report on Physics Model Demonstration at Baptist Higher Secondary School, Kohima, Nagaland.

On 30th august 2022 the department of physics SJC(A) under the supervision of Fr. Peter Solo the Dean of Science organised an extension program on Physics Model Demonstration at Baptist Higher secondary school, kohima. Selected students were chosen for the programme from the department two from 5th semester- Sister Angelle Shingnaisui and brother Anand dungdung, four from 3rd semster- Mary Yanlem, Chumbise Sangtam, Mairitadbo Abonmai and Nuklaienla Jamir. They were each given a table for their respective experiments. As the program was for basic physics principle and basic scientific experiment, students from science stream were chosen, particularly the 12th standard science students were invited for the programme.

To start the extension program, introductory note was given by Miss Sakurepla Assistant Professor, Department of Physics SJC(A) and brief about the model as well. Nuklaienla Jamir demonstrate about expansion and contraction of muscles on one of the student hand by an Electromyography device. Sociology Gives Back 2022

30th April 2022: <u>Sociology Gives Back:</u> The department faculties along with the BA 6th Semester students visited the Jakhama villagers as a community outreach programme under the theme "Sociology Gives Back" an annual activity of the department. The department organised such programmes as it is one of the objectives and also to in still the values of serving the society among the staff and students. The students as well as the faculties donated in cash and kind to the Jakhama villagers and also helped an NGO – Operation Rescue, Dimapur Nagaland with whom the department sign an MOU.

The beneficiaries of this year's Sociology Gives Back was selected through careful deliberation by the department on need base. Twenty Household living below poverty level i,e widows, destitute and orphans were selected from Jakhama Village with the consultation and recommendation of the Village authority and the Student Union of Jakhama Village. The group was divided into 6 teams and each visited 3 to 4 households and a sum of Rs. 3000 was given to each household in cash along with prayers and words of encouragements from the teachers and students.

A sum of Rs. 30,000 was given to the second beneficiary 'Operation Rescue', a child care project based in Dimapur. This NGO provides free education and meal to the children belonging to the poor families.

Mushroom Spawn Cultivation

An Innovative undertaking on Mushroom Spawn production by the Department of Botany

Mushroom cultivation, an environmentally friendly farming has played an integral part in agriculture. Being one of the ideal food items, mushroom needs to be explored for its impact in the economy, medicinal and nutritional properties and in the maintenance of health. There are about 2000 species of mushroom and only a small percent has been exploited the world over. Role of mushroom in sustainability and food security makes mushroom cultivation an important area to be discussed and practiced in a large scale.

Oyster Mushroom

The *Pleurotus* spp. derives their name due to the oyster-like shape. It has a wide range of temperature adaptability making it resilient to climatic conditions and therefore, available almost round the year.

Spawn production

Spawn comprises of mycelia of the fungus profusely multiplying on a substrate such as wheat or paddy grains. For the production of good quality spawn, supplies such as paddy grains, sterile laboratory conditions with laminar air flow and storage temperature of about 25±2°C were taken into considerations to avoid any contamination.

Pure culture preparation


Pure culture of Oyster mushroom was obtained using Potato Dextrose Agar (PDA) media. The mycelia plug is placed on the petri plates containing the media and incubated at a temperature of 25±2°C. In about a week or two mycelium is observed on the entire surface of the media ready to be inoculated.

Paddy grains as a suitable substrate is washed and pressurized to open the husk grains. After excess water is drained, about 20g of calcium carbonate (CaCO₃) is mixed with per kg of grains to increase the pH suitable for the rapid growth of spawn. The mixture of about 200g is filled in a polypropylene bag and plugged with cotton plugs, autoclave for about 1 or 2 hours. Once the polypropylene bags were cooled, mycelium from pure culture media and tissue taken

aseptically from the stalk were inoculated inside the laminar air flow and stored in a dark room. Mycelium were observed in about a week.

PROSPECT

The opportunities mushroom cultivation holds can open ample doors for the benefit of people in need of employment and people in general. As food demand increases, mushroom cultivation can decrease burden on other food produce due to its inexpensive and easy availability of requirements needed for cultivation. For the health conscious, it serves as a great dietary food. The medicinal and nutritional properties can be explored creating more avenues. Production of good quality spawn in itself is a promising endeavor, which is the key factor for the success of mushroom cultivation.

Report on the extension programme on "FUN WITH MATHS"



"Science In Everyday Life"

The Department of Chemistry has conducted extension program on the topic "Science in Everyday Life" on 22nd and 25th April, 2022 at Govt. High School, Jakhama and Sacred Heart High School, Khuzama respectively. **Eleven (11) students participated in the activity**.

Following are the experimental demonstrations performed by the students:

- 1. Preparation of Hand Sanitizers
- 2. Detection of Adulterants in food
- 3. Synthesis of Bioplastics
- 4. Fun with chemistry

The general objective of this extension program was to influence the younger generation to change their perspective towards science particularly chemistry and encourage them to develop their interest and pursue the field. The chemistry students demonstrated the practical activities and explained with great clarity. This activity helps the students to relate the topic to themselves by performing an experiment where they have learnt to differentiate adulterated food substance from non-adulterated food, importance and making of bioplastics and preparation of hand sanitizers. 



Report on NSS training program on Leadership and Personality Development through Life Skills conducted from 9th-11th September, 2021

The NSS training program on Leadership and Personality Development through Life Skills was conducted from 9th-11th September, 2021 at St.Joseph's College(A), Jakhama. The training program for the first batch was attended by **40 participants** from different schools and colleges. The college bus was provided to commute the participants.

On the first day, a short inaugural program was held at the PG Building Conference Hall at 10:00AM. The program was chaired by Mr. Kelengol Neikha, PO(NSS), SJC(A), Jakhama. The invocation prayer was pronounced by Rev. Fr. Obed Yimchunger, Vice-Principal (Students' Affairs), SJC(A), Jakhama and the welcome address was given by Rev. Fr. Dr. Keduolhou George Angami, Principal, SJC(A), Jakhama. A special number was presented by NSS Volunteer, followed by a message from Mr. Zeneikho Pfukha, State NSS Officer, NSS Cell. The inaugural program was followed by ice breaking session where the participants introduced themselves and shared their interests based on the candies they picked. A quick photo session was held, followed by a tea break.

After the break, Rev.Fr.Dr. George Rino (PG Coordinator), SJC(A), Jakhama, took up two sessions on Leadership and Personality Development. It was then followed by Lunch Break, after which the third session on Youth Health Awareness began with Mr. Ainato Yeptho (Deputy Director, NSAAC) and Mr. Bendang Imsong as the resource persons. They emphasised on HIV/AIDs and TB and voluntary blood donation respectively. Mr. Ainato stressed on how the diseases like HIV/AIDs and TB are transmitted and the means to prevent them. The last session was on Interpersonal Relations and Effective Communication. Here, the participants were encouraged to have more discussions. Some games and activities were also incorporated to get better insights on the topics.

The third day of the program started at 9:30AM with Mr. Avisa Chase(PT) initiating some stretches and dances, which the participants thoroughly enjoyed. The resource person for the day was Miss. 




